Sex - why is it so difficult to talk about it?

- it is private
- it can be confusing
- it sometimes involves guilt or shame
- it is often seen as something dirty

Sex - why is it so important to talk about it?

- it is prevalent
- it is powerful
 - potential to build up
 - potential to destroy

Sex - according to God's design

- sex is good
- sex is a metaphor
 - reflects the creativeness of our God
 - reflects God as Trinity

Sex - problem with only emphasizing the don'ts

- focuses on repression, not discipline
- focuses on what you don't have rather than on what you do have
- potential to make marriage and sex into an idol

Sex - we need to rethink our concept of virginity

- not just physical
- but an attitude of the heart

Sex - seeking after sexual wholeness

general sexuality (gender)
romantic sexuality
erotic sexuality (marriage)

- How do I live out my God-given sexuality in the General and Romantic Sexuality spheres?
- How do I discipline my God-given sexuality so that I don't move too quickly into the Romantic sphere, or even into the sphere of erotic sexuality?

Sex - things the world tells us are OK outside of marriage

- masturbation
- pornography
- oral sex
- homosexuality
- hooking up

For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God; that no one transgress and wrong his brother in this matter... For God has not called us for impurity, but in holiness. —1 Thessalonians 4:3-7
